Allison Massey spoke 2 weeks ago at the Sunrise Club.

Allison talked about her connection with Rotary beginning some 30 years ago as an outbound student to South Africa with Port Macquarie Club and what was then District 965. From beach mermaid - discos at the Civic Centre - working in the family business 'Schnitzel House' to Macquarie Uni studying a Bachelor of Arts and Communications.

Earning a bursary with the CBA enabled Allison to work in internal communications, giving her a passion for investing in an internal culture which gives energy and allows the team to do their best. Working at AMP, St George Bank and now the NAB, Allison feels she is proud to be a banker.

Allison too, has a connection with Nepal and in 2005 returned to Port Macquarie raising her sons. In 2015, Allison took a position in Melbourne but soon felt Port pulling her back.

When President of the P&C at Tacking Point Public School, Allison worked in partnership with Rotary Club of Port Macquarie West to build cricket nets, so on her return in 2016, it was the right time to return to the Rotary fold.

Endeavour clubhouse provides

innovative approaches to mental health

Our speaker, Associate Professor Anthony Harris is a consultant psychiatrist and co-chair of Sydney Medical School's Neuroscience and Mental Health Research area. He is familiar with some of Rotary's work, having been a recipient of an Australian Rotary Health

research grant.



He reminded us that people with mental illnesses die 15 years earlier than the rest of the population, using the result of not accessing proper care or not having adequate care provided. They often struggle socially, with men living apart and most women having children removed.

The benefit of Endeavour Clubhouse is that it tries to take people isolated by mental illness and give them a community who understands the isolating effects, that includes shyness and social skills. It attempts to construct building blocks of regular life with involvement in activities including cooking and preparation of the program. This gives responsibility back to them, returning ideas of work, structure, nurture and encouragement to reach standards. Clubhouse members look after clubhouse members.

Ultimately, the clubhouse supports the recovery process.
