

Alan then moved to Computers & apart for a 2 year stint as National Parts Manager, worked for Higer Bus, JAC Trucks & LDV



Tonights Speaker - Paul Rayner SLSA

Paul was the inaugural winner of our club's ROTARY EMERGENCY SERVICES VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR Award in 2014. Paul is the Director of Surf Lifesaving & spoke about some of the SLSA Support Operations behind the scenes involved in surf life saving.

There are 303 surf clubs in Australia & 129 clubs in NSW. Sadly NSW sees half the surf drownings in Australia.

Paul and his wife are two of six Duty Officers in this Region which stretches from South West Rocks to the Camden Haven with 8 Surf Life Saving Clubs in this region. He spoke about SurfCom a modern communications pioneered in this region. The use of RWCs (Jet Skis) & IRBs (Inflatable Rubber Boats). Search & Rescue & how the SLSA works under the Police and alongside other rescue organisations in surf rescues & searches for bodies.


