It was an inspirational evening & thanks to the Westport Rotary Club & especially Trevor Gilson for hosting.

The IR President spoke on his theme for this Rotary year - ROTARY MAKING A DIFFERENCE. He commented that in his opinion we don't sell our organisation well to potential members of Rotary. To sell Rotary he is gathering the following information & hopes to have a world figure for presentation to the media & local clubs -

1. In one year - how much has your club spent (in Aus \$\$\$) on community projects?

2. In one year - how many work hours have our


club members spent in doing good in the community?

Should be interesting to see the results of these two questions when the 35,000 Rotary clubs submit their answers.

RI President Ian has also introduced two new innovations -

The Presidential Citation - in the past it has been almost impossible for a local clubs to obtain one of there prestigious citations due to the almost unachievable criteria. Ian is simplifying this process.
 He is requesting every member of Rotary to plant a tree this year. Imagine if 1.2million Rotarians worldwide each plant a tree! What a difference to our environment this would make.
 The RI President is also holding SIX Presidential Conferences this year, aimed at building peace. One will be held in Sydney (date tba). What a humble & inspirational RI leader we have in Rotary this year.
